Someone asked me recently whether Palm Sunday was a joyful occasion in our congregation. She inquired further: "Or, do you leap right into the sadness and tragedy of what is to come?" She had a strong preference for staying with the celebrative mood.

I personally find Palm Sunday a challenging day. Its irony is inescapable. That we can, along with the ancient crowds, wholeheartedly welcome Jesus only to keep silence and turn away a few days (or hours) later, makes it painful . . . and real.

Taking delight in Jesus' presence, and in his radically alternative way, is genuine. But so is the frailty and fear that prevent us from courageous action. Yet God is our God, and has given us light!

All: God has given us light!


